Key Chinese Community Leaders To Speak On Proportional Representation Referendum

VANCOUVER, BC (September 18th, 2018) – A number of influential leaders from BC’s Chinese community will join former BC Attorney General Suzanne Anton QC and Bill Tieleman from the No to BC Proportional Representation Society, as well as Mr Tung Chan, OBC, TOMORROW, **Wednesday September 19th at 11am**, to give their perspective on the upcoming provincial referendum on Proportional Representation.

The community leaders will give brief remarks as they detail their opposition to changing from our current simple, stable and successful first past the post system in BC.

From October 22nd, voters will start receiving a mail-in ballot on the future of our electoral system, asking whether they would like to keep the current First Past the Post system, or replace it with Proportional Representation.

To vote in the referendum, voters must be 18 years or older as of November 30th 2018, a Canadian citizen and a BC resident for at least six months prior to November 30th 2018. Voting packages need to be completed and returned by November 30th 2018.
